MEASURE 1



In 2019, the State Legislature passed a resolution to refer this constitutional amendment to the ballot for voters to decide on changes to the State Board of Higher Education.

YES Vote - A yes vote would expand the membership of the State Board of Higher Education from 8 to 15 voting members and increase term length from 4 to 6 years. The measure would also prohibit state employees, state officials, and legislators from becoming members.

NO Vote - The State Board of Education structure would remain the same.

MEASURE 2



In 2019, the State Legislature passed a resolution to refer this constitutional amendment to the ballot for voters to decide on changing the initiated measure process.

YES Vote - A yes vote would require voter-initiated constitutional measures passed by the voters to also be approved by the Legislature. If rejected by the Legislature, the measure would be placed back on the ballot at the next statewide election and take effect if approved again by the voters.

NO Vote - The initiated measure process would remain the same. Currently, voter-initiated constitutional amendments take effect if they receive a majority vote in a statewide election.
